Minors are not allowed in the POW*MIA Awareness Rally Motorcycle Shovel Races. Individuals under the age of 18 may not participate in the POW*MIA Awareness Rally Motorcycle Shovel Races.

POW*MIA MOTORCYCLE SHOVEL RACE RULES

1. This is a completely open competition with no class distinctions.
2. Number plates are required to be mounted on the front headlight of the bike.
3. One rider per bike from start to finish of competition.
4. All bikes must have **unaltered** street tread tires only. There can be no on/off road tires or special tires for dirt.
5. Any size bike can be run as long as it uses gasoline only.
6. No nitro, nitrous, alcohol, blower or turbo.
7. 5 mph speed limit in the pit and staging area.
8. Any rider endangering anyone at any time will be DISQUALIFIED without a refund.
Endangerment will be determined by the race official and may also include race volunteers.
9. Riders will flip for lane choice in the staging area. The driver with the lower number will call the toss. The winner will have their choice of lane. If you are running the same opponent for a second time, the loser of the first coin flip will pick the lane they want. If you are running with the same opponent the third time there will be another coin flip with the higher number calling it in the air.
10. All riders will be given a double elimination attempt with victors staying in the top bracket and the other racer moving to the corresponding bracket.
11. In the event that weather puts an end to the competition all riders still in the winner's bracket will get together for a coin toss to determine first, second and third place.
12. Any rider not at the start line within 30 seconds of the end of the previous race will be given a loss. In the event both bikes fail to make it to the starting line within 30 seconds of call to line a coin toss will determine the outcome of the race.
13. If you are not about to race, next up, you are required to stay out of the staging area. One help member is allowed in the staging area.
14. Top four racers will put their bikes in the staging area after their final race where they will be re-inspected and no one will be allowed to be near them until the final races start.
15. 30 seconds to starting line is in effect after first call to line.
16. Riders will be given a 15 minute cool down time between races. If you are called before your 15 minutes is up please let a crew member know. It is your responsibility to keep track of this time.
17. Racers with a bye run will be required to run the race.
18. Your bike is subject to inspection at any time the races are happening.

19. Finishes will be judged by the shovel race rider crossing the line.
20. Inappropriate complaining to an official about the results of a race will result in an automatic loss. This will be determined by the race official.
21. The track officials reserve the right to ask anyone to leave the property at any time.
22. Drugs and glass containers of any kind are not allowed in the race area.
23. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed in the race area. Riders are not allowed to ingest any alcohol during times of the race even if they are not racing at the time. If it is determined you are impaired during the race you will be asked to leave. This determination on will be at the sole discretion of race personnel and will not include a refund.

VIOLATION OF THE ABOVE RULES WILL RESULT IN YOUR BEING ASKED TO LEAVE WITHOUT A REFUND
